Ekiden Relay

Boy's Results

Match 1: KICE defeated Willunga (22-12)

The last five minutes were just as tough and KICE were able to even the score up with 30 seconds left on the clock. Woodcroft worked the ball down court and were able to score. KICE had 10 seconds to get the ball down court and put up a shot which bounced off the rim. The boys left everything on court and should be proud of their achievements on the day.
